Juvenile Substance Abuse Program JSAP

The Juvenile Substance Abuse Program (JSAP) provides treatment for adolescents and their families who have experienced problems as a result of substance use. This program aims to educate adolescents on their substance use, and to help resolve issues that may be leading to continued use and abuse of substances. The program also seeks to educate families on the extent of their child's substance abuse and helps families deal with issues that are necessary for the desired change. Members will learn new ways of behaving and interacting with others. The adolescents will also develop a relapse prevention plan that will be presented to their parents. In addition to acknowledging how their substance use has hurt themselves and their families, members will learn of recovery principles, and if applied can lead to successful outcomes.

The JSAP program includes

- Assessment and Intake
- Group therapy
- Family group
- Education group
- Relapse prevention group
- Individual sessions if necessary
- Outside 12 step attendance (a minimum of one per week)
- Random Drug Testing (8-panel testing)

The JSAP program consists of four levels.

Beginning Level

- Assessment and Intake
- Relapse and Family group (A parent will be required to attend a minimum of two sessions per month)
- Group therapy
- Education group
- 12-step attendance (a minimum of one per week)
- A minimum of 6 consecutive clean drug tests (8-panel testing)

Intermediate Level

Relapse and Family group (A parent will be required to attend a minimum of two sessions per month)
Group therapy
12 step attendance (a minimum of one per week)
Continued negative drug tests
Relapse Prevention Plan will be in place

Progressive Level

Relapse and Family group (A parent will be required to attend a minimum of one group per month)
12 step attendance (a minimum of one per week)
Continued negative drug tests

Aftercare Level

Relapse and Family group one time per month. The aftercare group will be attended for a minimum of two months. (A parent will be required to attend this session)

* Before elevation to the Intermediate Level, Progressive Level, and Aftercare Level, another group member, probation officer (if applicable), and a parent will need to write a letter recommending the level change including progress that has been made.

* Non compliance and or positive drug tests may result in starting a level over.
